1. Introduction

The C4 Mobility in Lithuania has been successfully completed. The objectives of the mobility were:

- increasing knowledge and practical abilities in recycling and European trades of circular economy;
- strategies for recycling waste;
- gaining participator methodology, based on discovering, exploring & collaboration;
- using active learning methods personally experiencing the process of circular economy.

2. Summary of Feedback

The mobility in Lithuania took place from the 14th to 18th of March, 2022 with 41 participants- 29 students and 12 teachers.

Each day ended with an evaluation of completed activities by using different Web2 tools (Mentimeter, Padlet, Google forms). The final evaluation of the mobility was carried out on the last day.

In the feedback questionnaire 94.7% of the respondents agreed to the statement 'I have increased knowledge in recycling and European trades of circular economy'. 5.3% of the participants agreed with the statement partly.

78.9% of the participants agreed that they have gained practical abilities in recycling and European trades of circular economy, while others chose 'partly agree' option.

The results show that 84.2% of the students participating in the mobility have learnt new strategies for recycling waste. 15.8% of the respondents think that they have learnt new strategies for recycling waste partially.

89.5% of the participants agreed that they have gained participator methodology, based on discovering, exploring & collaboration, while 10.5% of the students chose the answer 'partly agree'.

94.7% of the participants agreed with the statement 'Using active learning methods I personally experienced the process of circular economy'.

3. Conclusion

The conclusions drawn from this report are the following:

- the activities were impeccably organized and well- structured;
- the activities were organized with both theoretical basis and interesting workshops;
- the keywords of the week were RECYCLING, REUSE, REDUCE, RESPECT, RETHINK, REPAIR, REPURPOSE, REHOME, RESTORE, CIRCULAR ECONOMY;
- the activities carried out during the week represented beneficial experiences for interacting with students from the partner countries in the project;
- they have also developed their work team for a good outcome to enjoy together;
- all the children have realized that they could positively change the world we live in if they change themselves first;
- the mobility was earned out as scheduled and the program was completely realized;
- the objectives of the mobility were reached;
